

## Project Completion Report: Rhuo Water System Revamp in TA Mabuka, Mulanje



### Project Overview:

The water system revamp project in TA Mabuka, Mulanje, was implemented to address the critical issue of broken and washed out water pipes from the source, which had left 1,000 households without access to clean and reliable water. The project aimed to replace substandard pipes, repair and replace broken pipes, and empower the local community to manage and maintain the system.

### Project Funders:

This project was made possible through the generous funding of CART (Christian African Relief Trust Trust).

### Project Outcomes:

- Clean and reliable water supply restored to 1,000 households
- Reduced risk of water-borne diseases, improving public health
- Increased access to water for domestic, agricultural, and economic use
- Empowered local community to manage and maintain their water system through training and capacity building
- Improved community engagement and ownership of the water system

### Training and Capacity Building:

The project managed to train 20 community members on water system maintenance and repair and we over saw the establishment of a functional Water User Association to oversee system management and maintenance with the support of depart of water from the local council.
